Hotel Baths - Notes on Analyses

Our full sample consisted of 618 U.S. resident MTurkers with at least a 95% approval rating. They were paid \$0.25. The first survey question asked participants to indicate whether they had spent at least one night in a hotel room during the past year. For those who said "No" (n = 78) the survey ended immediately. Eight additional participants quit the survey without answering any of the critical questions, and, of the remaining 532, 90 said that their hotel room definitely did not have a bathtub.

Analyses on the participants' last hotel stay were conducted on the remaining 442 people, except for the gender analyses, which excluded 4 additional participants who did not specify their gender.

Analyses on whether participants had *ever*, as an adult, bathed in a hotel room retained those who said their last hotel stay did not have a bathtub (N = 532).
